The nation's first distillery to be named "Distillery of the Year" is set on the quiet banks of the Kentucky River where the mighty buffalo cut paths, known as traces. Today, the bold spirit of early America is preserved at Buffalo Trace, where your group may enjoy the rustic, cabin-style clubhouse with kitchen facilities and covered porches overlooking the grounds. The Master Distiller's Room offers an intimate setting for a small meeting.

Built in 1814 by John Wesley Hunt, the area’s first millionaire, this Federal-style house is a living museum representing the days when Lexington was known as the “Athens of the West.” The property includes a Civil War Museum and a period garden complete with a bridge gazebo. The lovely home features a three-story cantilevered staircase, walled courtyard, fine Kentucky period furniture and early 19th century portraits and porcelains.

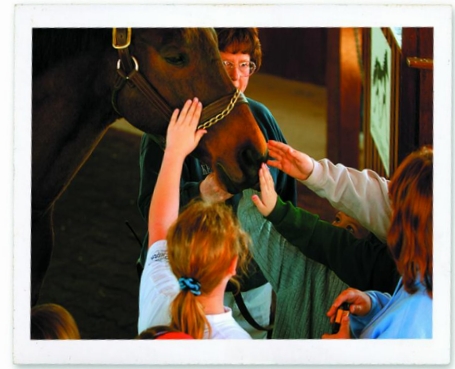
With its tranquil setting and lovely stone fences and buildings, this National Historic Landmark is one of the most genteel and beautiful racecourses in the world. The Keene Barn and Entertainment Center adjacent to the racecourse each offer 10,000 square feet of special event space. The Keene Barn is available Memorial Day through Labor Day and the Entertainment Center is available year-round (excluding April and October) with on-site catering for each.

Lexington's premiere attraction and home to the Alltech FEI World Equestrian Games 2010, the Kentucky Horse Park is a showcase of museums, galleries, theatres and exhibits all dedicated to the horse. A working farm, the Horse Park's 1,200 acres are home to more than 50 breeds of horses. The tasteful Club Lounge includes a built-in bar and the Steeplechase Barn is excellent for casual barbeques and parties. Ground will be broken soon for a new indoor arena.

The Romanesque-style Kentucky Theater was built in 1922 and was restored to its original grandeur in 1992. The Kentucky Theater shows classic, modern and foreign films and hosts a variety of concerts, as well as the worldwide syndicated radio show *Woodsongs Old Time Radio Hour*. The State Theater, adjacent to the Kentucky, is equipped with video teleconferencing and is available for smaller groups. Sound and lighting technicians are available for either theater and prefunction space is available in the joint lobby.

Originally constructed in the 1880s, the Opera House was restored to its original splendor in 1976. The finely appointed showplace features Broadway plays and musicals as well as local arts presentations and can elegantly accommodate meetings and conferences. Built in 1989, the Lexington Public Library is located in the very center of downtown Lexington and is adjacent to covered parking, banks and restaurants. The library atrium features an operating Foucault pendulum and the Library Gallery hosts rotating art exhibits. The meeting facilities available include three conference rooms, the Board Room and the theater.

Named for the native red soil that covers the one mile oval harness track, The Red Mile is Lexington's oldest existing racetrack, dating back to 1875. Three newly renovated indoor areas are available for special events: the Grandstand, Clubhouse and Tattersalls Arena. The Paddock Park lends itself to large gatherings with special ambiance for corporate gatherings and weddings.

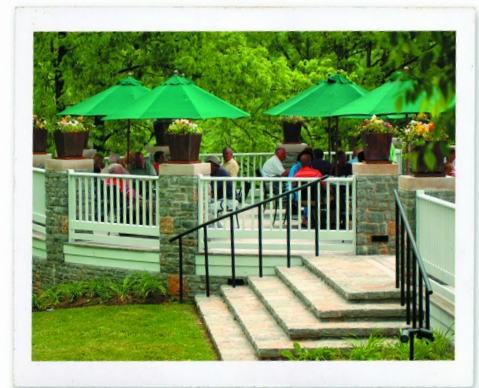
